	<p><u>Course Dates</u></p> <p>September 7 - November 13 (10 weeks)</p> <p><u>Course Credits</u></p> <p>1 credit graduate/undergraduate non-credit workshop</p> <p><u>Course Description</u></p> <p>Gain the basic knowledge and skills needed to make EE relevant to culturally diverse audiences. Explore perspectives of EE that encompass interests and issues of concern to culturally diverse audiences, assess barriers to participation among culturally diverse audiences, and apply cultural competency skills in building relationships and partnerships with members of culturally diverse audiences.</p>	<p><u>Course Dates</u></p> <p>September 7 - November 27 (12 weeks)</p> <p><u>Course Credits</u></p> <p>3 credit graduate/undergraduate non-credit workshop</p> <p><u>Course Description</u></p> <p>Gain a foundational knowledge of environmental education (EE) and learn how to incorporate quality EE into your instruction. Participants discuss the history and goals of EE and develop an understanding of the professional roles and instructional methods of environmental educators.</p>

	<p><u>Course Dates</u></p> <p>September 7 - December 4 (13 weeks)</p> <p><u>Course Credits</u></p> <p>3 credit graduate/undergraduate non-credit workshop</p> <p><u>Course Description</u></p> <p>Learn to evaluate environmental education and outreach programs by designing evaluation tools such as questionnaires, observation forms, and interview and focus group guides. This course was designed for environmental educators, natural resource professionals, and graduate students who can apply the tools they develop to a specific education program or research study</p>	<p><u>Course Dates</u></p> <p>September 7 - November 6 (9 weeks)</p> <p><u>Course Credits</u></p> <p>2 credit graduate non-credit workshop</p> <p><u>Course Description</u></p> <p>Learn how to develop successful strategic planning and implementation models, processes and techniques. Emphasis will be placed on managing the strategic planning process to build the capacity of organizations to provide effective environmental education programs. This course is designed for environmental educators, natural resource professionals and graduate students.</p>
